Our graduates go on to excel in all facets of their high school careers. There are a number of graduates who currently serve on their schools' executive councils, who are class presidents, and who are student body presidents and vice presidents. There are many others who are varsity team captains, club presidents, and drum majors. They are leaders in every aspect—on the field and court, in the classroom, in their parishes, and in their communities. We are proud to be a foundation for their excellence. So, while admittedly, we attract academically capable students to begin with, our program nevertheless challenges them to excel not only beyond their peers but also to reach their own full academic potential.

In part this happens because we are blessed with outstanding teachers. Our faculty is comprised of men from all vocations of life who are committed to helping live out our motto of growing your sons into young Christian gentlemen. Some are life-long educators and some make CBS their home after a journey from someplace else. No matter their eventual path to CBS, all are committed to the mission of Christian Brothers School to provide the highest level of education.

But it is our students that most embody the ideals of our school and our mission. This year's student body is made up of 350 students representing 25 different elementary schools throughout the New Orleans area. They all are of above average academic ability and all participate in a grade-level accelerated program. They do so in an academically accelerated environment—not simply via an accelerated curriculum but via advanced instruction and exceptional expectations as well. For our students, this is not a lateral move academically; instead, it is an intentional focus on content, skills, and characteristics that promote academic success and independence in preparation for an accelerated high school program and life beyond.

Our program is centered on our grade-level accelerated curriculum, which includes a solid foundation in study skills, organizational and time management skills, note-taking, and technology integration. Built upon that foundation is an advanced course of study including English, science (with a STEM-based component), mathematics, literature, computer, Spanish, and religion. Our students learn to balance the traditional skills of academia with more modern skills involving technology, problem-solving, and interpersonal work.

In addition, we believe that the middle-school boy thrives in an environment that allows for adequate play and outdoor exploration. Our students participate in recess and Physical Education every day. They have dozens of opportunities for physical activity during the school day and outside of school hours, including school athletic teams that stress commitment and excellence and a robust intramural program which promotes participation and interaction with classmates, in addition to daily opportunities to explore in and engage with our beautiful campus.

And most importantly all of this is done in an atmosphere imbued with and inspired by the Gospel values of Jesus Christ. As our founder, the patron saint of teachers, John Baptist de La Salle, said, teachers are called to be brothers to one another and older brothers to the students entrusted to their care. The hallmark of a Lasallian education, particularly at Christian Brothers, is the relationship—relationships between and among students and teachers which are based on a mutual love and respect grounded in those Gospel values.

Christian Brothers School is unapologetically unique. Our environment is intentionally crafted for the specific development of the middle school boy. We guide and support our students to discover their own academic independence and self-reliance. We push them out of their comfort zones to reach their full potential not only as learners but also as people and children of God. Our programs are designed to help them not just succeed but to thrive. 


